Product data sheet

1. General description

Planar passivated high commutation three quadrant triac in a TO263 (D2PAK) surface mountable plastic package. This triac is intended for use in motor control circuits where high blocking voltage, high static and dynamic dV_D/dt as well as high dI_{com}/dt can occur. This "series C0T" triac will commutate the full rated RMS current at the maximum rated junction temperature without the aid of a snubber. This device has high operating capability ($T_{i(max)} = 150~{^\circ}C$)

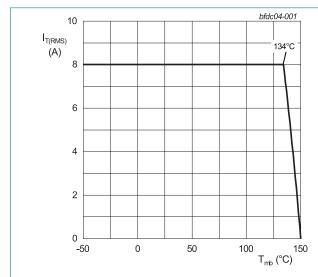
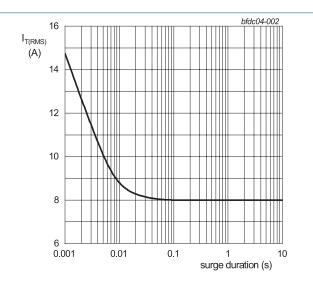
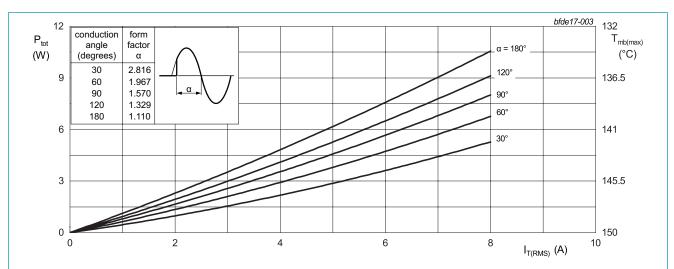


Fig. 1. RMS on-state current as a function of mounting base temperature; maximum values



 $f = 50 \text{ Hz}; T_{mb} = 134 \text{ }^{\circ}\text{C}$

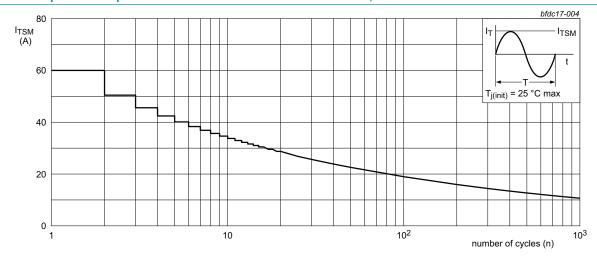
Fig. 2. RMS on-state current as a function of surge duration; maximum values



 α = conduction angle

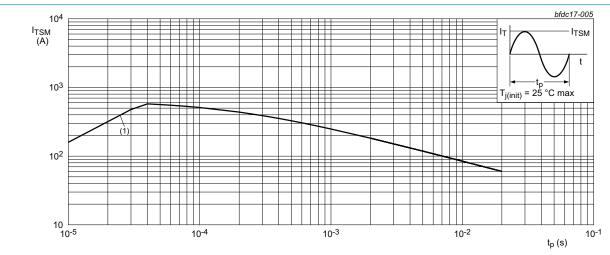

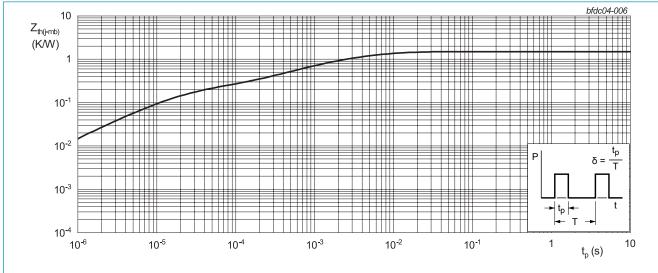


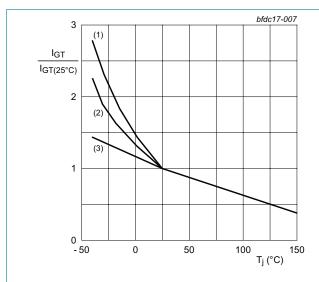
Fig. 6. Transient thermal impedance from junction to mounting base as a function of pulse width

Fig. 7. Normalized gate trigger current as a function of junction temperature

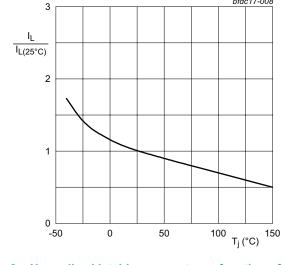


Fig. 8. Normalized latching current as a function of junction temperature

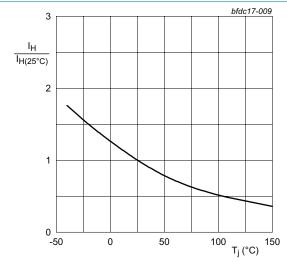
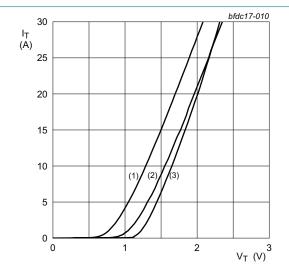


Fig. 9. Normalized holding current as a function of junction temperature

Fig. 10. On-state current as a function of on-state voltage

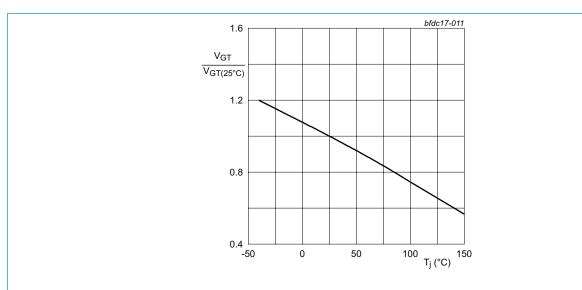
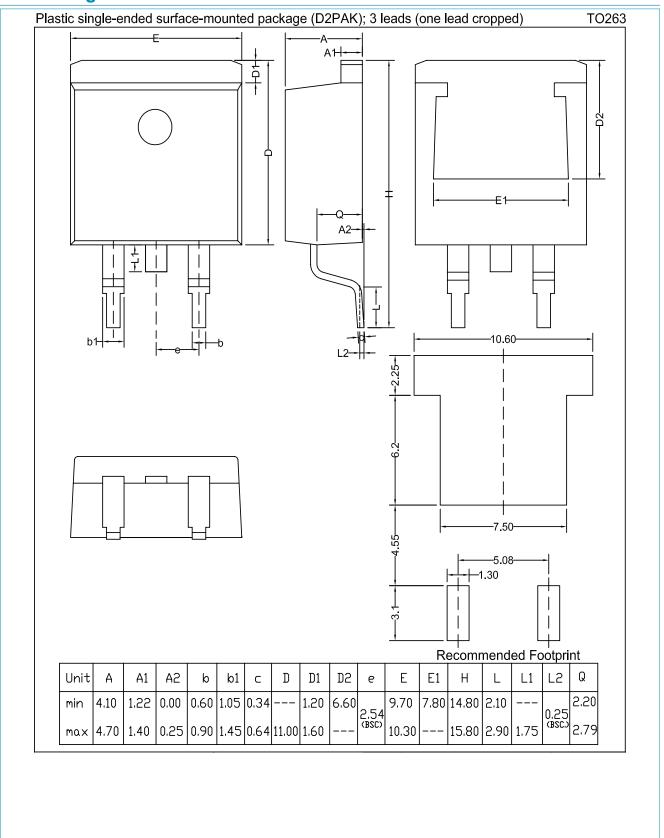


Fig. 11. Normalized gate trigger voltage as a function of junction temperature
